During PE this term the focus was on Tennis, Rounders, Badminton and Cricket. As groups we discussed famous rivalries in the sports - McEnroe and Borg, The Ashes and Nick Kyrios. Furthermore, learning surrounding rules, morals, sportsmanship, and cheating were identified as key elements of the debates. Additionally, during the practical aspects of the lesson, pupils learnt about contact points, shoulder turns, swing paths and effective footwork.

In ICT this term we have been answering the EQ through coding good characters in Star Wars and Minecraft to prevail over the evil characters. In addition to this, students have been thinking about the good and evil in formulas, calculations and spreadsheets whilst completing their BTEC coursework.

In science this term students have been looking at inheritance and genetics. Students have had to debate and answer some of the following questions, "Is it right to be able use medical research to eradicate disease and prolong human life?" and "Should humans have the right to play God and decide who should continue living?".

Sports Day

Friday 30th June saw Bridge House host our second 'Summer Sports Spectacular' at the Princess Royal Arena. Throughout the day, our children participated in multiple races including sprints, hurdles, obstacles, sack, egg and spoon as well as a team relay race. Pupils displayed great concentration, athleticism, and resilience to complete the races and score points for their teams. It was great to see all campuses come together and support and cheer each other on.

Each team also took part in 5 different challenges for 10 minutes each to try and score as many points as possible for their team. Challenges included skittles and long jump, which allowed great displays of team spirit to encourage and discuss tactics to achieve optimum success, to score the maximum number of points. Some children displayed excellent levels of accuracy during the football and throwing challenges. The final challenge of tennis rallies saw children working together to break the previous record for the highest score (56).

The winning team once again and retaining their title as 'Best Team in School' were the yellow team. With superb efforts by Theo, LJ, Charlie, Swayley and Mikey!
