What makes me unique?

Students have been answering the enquiry question "What makes me Unique?" in ICT through the design creation and evaluation of unique 3D models. These models have included Buildings, Name badges, food and drink and their own choice for a final 3D Model. Through our ICT enrichment our students have also answered the enquiry question by creating their own unique coding text and style to solve coding problems and through the design and creation of 3D graphics and models.

Students in Glen and Gwash have been learning about bones and muscles within the human body in Science. During these lessons they have had opportunities to play interactive quizzes and gameshows as well as using practical skills to work out which muscles are strongest in their bodies. They have role played being doctors by observing several x-rays and attempted to provide the correct diagnostic in terms of injuries sustained.

In Geography and History, using Boston and the surrounding area to support learning, Year 9 have been learning about votes for women focusing on the last century and the advancement in women's rights amongst ethnic groups.

WOW Day

For our WOW Day, happening on the 19^{th of} October, students will have the opportunity to spend their day having six exciting sessions where they will engage in activities that incorporate the Rivers and Waterways in our areas. This is a lovely way to introduce our new House names. Some of the sessions that students will be involved in

include River Monsters,
Origami Boats and Riverside
Poetry. In the afternoon,
students will take part in a
whole school Origami Boat
Race and a whole school
student presentation.

Creativity at Middle

We have been directly looking at the enquiry question this term in STEM with the year 9s exploring their own fingerprints and how they are unique to them.

Years 7 and 8 have been investigating their own culture and the local cultures that make us all unique. We have been exploring our history to and producing a range of sculptures.
